Provides observable, measureable evidence of student learning	Outcome does not accommodate an observable behavior	Outcome may be observable, but it is not clear that it can be measured, or it may be very difficult to measure	Outcome is observable and clearly lends itself to measurement
Aligns with program/course goal/objective	Outcome is not aligned with goals/objectives	Alignment with goals/objectives is questionable or unclear	Outcome is clearly aligned with goals/objectives
